Some projects come under the remit of existing groups – such as the **Little River Rail Trail Trust, Rod Donald Banks Peninsula Trust, Banks Peninsula Water Management Zone Committee, Little River Wairewa Community Trust, Love Little River**. You can help out by joining or supporting these groups.

Other projects, ideas and initiatives will need time and effort from **members of our community** (you!) to help make them happen.
